“Professor Barkanov also stated that a warmer relationship towards Russia could benefit NATO allies, as it is one way to avoid future potential military conflicts.”

“So the main benefit would be to address this problem in a way that could enhance the security situation.”

BUT WVU STUDENT GARRETT BURGESS, WHO STUDIES POLITICAL SCIENCE AND RUSSIAN STUDIES, SAID THAT IT IS UNCLEAR HOW A PRO-RUSSIAN STANCE WOULD INFLUENCE THE SYRIAN CIVIL WAR.

“The big thing that Trump is going to face with regards to pro-Russia is how he’s going to look at Syria now. Is a mutual relationship with Russia going to benefit in some way? There’s debate for either sides.”

AFTER RECENTLY CANCELLING A SCHEDULED MEETING WITH NATO OFFICIALS, SECRETARY OF STATE REX TILLERSON HAS RESCHEDULED TO MEET IN BRUSSELS ON MARCH 31ST. AND IN APRIL, HE’LL VISIT MOSCOW TO MEET WITH SENIOR MEMBERS OF THE RUSSIAN GOVERNMENT.

is a tiny little bucket that you only fill halfway is nothing compared to the huge jugs, and multiple jugs and buckets that women and young girls, especially, carry each day.”

“Women and children spend 125 million hours each year collecting water. That amounts to six hours of labor each day per person. The water is used for cooking, cleaning, and bathing- things that we have right at our fingertips, and so often take for granted.”

BUT FOR DETA KOLO-JOHNSON THIS EVENT HIT CLOSE TO HOME. SHE GREW UP IN TIMOR, AN ISLAND ON THE COAST OF INDONESIA. WHERE WALKING MILES FOR CLEAN WATER WAS A HUGE PART OF HER DAILY LIFE.

“I was one of the younger ones, so that was our job. So our parents would stay home, you know cook and stuff while the younger ones go try to gather water, as well as firewood to make a meal for the family. And we do that in the morning, afternoon, and evening cause obviously you need it for the 3 times a day that you eat you need water.”

“What we’re doing here is enabling the computer to have a sixth sense and this sixth sense is...or means that the computer can get a sense of confidence when it has to decide if its estimating its position right, so it’s getting that sense of confidence and that’s important cause it can actually save a lot of lives.”

“Self-driving cars have to recognize certain landmarks in a scene to navigate their location. Getting 3D models of cities will localize these cars by helping them recognize the landmarks and estimating the location of the camera in the car.”
