“Limited literacy affects people in lots of different ways. For adults it makes it challenging to get a job, to support their kids with their education. For kids it’s a whole part of growing up that they miss out on. Shared stories we have, fairy tales.”

“Living in a world that is fast-paced and ever-changing with low literacy rates can cost people a lot of issues such as being unable to hold a job, hold a bank account, and to efficiently manage their money.”

BUT THE LITERACY VOLUNTEERS OF MONONGALIA AND PRESTON COUNTY ARE TRYING TO RAISE THOSE READING LEVELS.

“About a fifth of West Virginians are functionally illiterate or at least reading below a fourth or third grade reading level.”
