“We have pedestrians that are inattentive and don’t use crosswalks. We have drivers that are inattentive, using electronic devices when they should not be, not paying attention to traffic control devices, failure to signal when they change lanes.”

“There have been six accidents recorded at this intersection in the past year, two of them involving pedestrians, one of them fatal, and there is little to no survival rate of being hit by any car at any speed. Police say anything over 45mph is considered potentially fatal.”

THE CITY IS WORKING WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS TO PUT NEW TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS IN AREAS WITH A LOT OF PEDESTRIANS, BUT IT’S UP TO DRIVERS AND PEDESTRIANS TO STAY ALERT AND PUT SAFETY FIRST.

SERGEANT CURT THOMAS OF THE MONONGALIA COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT SAYS THAT MOST PEOPLE DON'T REALIZE THAT THE MEDICINE THEY ARE PRESCRIBED CAN AFFECT THEIR ABILITY BEHIND THE WHEEL.

"And that person's excuse was, 'well I was prescribed these so I should be able to drive on them,' but he was so impaired, he would fall asleep mid-sentence. That's how bad it was."

"When a cop pulls you over, they will ask you to get out of the car and perform a series of field tests, but the easiest way to see if someone has taken drugs...is by shining a flashlight in their eyes."

"He was under medication. I don't know what kind of medication, if it was sleep medication, but he should not have been driving."
